Virtual Time Travel Trail

- 1 Henry Sandon Hall, Royal Porcelain Works** - 'The Dr. Ordered Clay', 20 minute redigitised film brings to life Worcester Porcelain's pioneering ceramic manufacturing process, starting with the mining of clay in Cornwall right through to decoration of the final product. Open 6-10pm.
- 2 The Commandery** - Large scale projection on rear elevation of the building telling the story of industry in Worcester through photos and interviews. Rear courtyard open 6-10pm. Café open 6-8pm.
- 3 The Cathedral** - Journey back in time to 1950s and beyond through wars, Victorian inventions and our connections to history right back to the Anglo-Saxons. Guides will take you on a journey to explore the Cathedral at night. Open 6-9pm.
- 4 Tudor House Museum** - Projections in the rear courtyard illustrating everyday life and change in Worcester. The museum will also be open from 6-10pm.
- 5 Greyfriars** - Projections in the garden on the history of the Greyfriars. Open 6-10pm.
- 6 The Guildhall** - Come and see our 1950s High Street exhibition. Open 6-10pm.
- 7 St Swithun's Church** - Large scale projections onto east elevation illustrating the city centre and shopping in Worcester in the mid-20th Century, 6-10pm. The church will be open and showing the 'Life in 4 minutes' light and sound show, 6-8.30pm.
- 8 Corner of New Street/Cornmarket** - Large scale projection onto New Street elevation telling the story of entertainment in Worcester in the mid-20th Century. 6-10pm.
- 9 Hope Church, St Martin's Quarter** - Worcester Voices – a documentary by Worcester Mela, showing on a loop from 6-10pm.
- 10 The Hive** - Worcestershire on Film. Visit the Hive café to see film footage of Worcester from the late 1940s to 1960s. 6-9pm.
- 11 The Infirmary Museum, City Campus** - Projections inside the museum on Worcester's medical history. The museum is also open, 6-10pm.
- 12 Worcester City Art Gallery and Museum** - Projections about Worcester's gloving industry and collection. The museum and café are open 6-8.30pm.
